Storytelling



On _____, be prepared to tell to the group at least on story which come from and oral source (as opposed to telling a story read from a book.)



Although this is by no means a complete listing of possibilities these are some suggestions as to what types to choose from.



1. Courtin' stories from your family



- How did Grandpa and Grandma meet?
- Did Aunt Lucy have one great "lost love" to share?
- Are there and wartime romances?



2. Huntin' or fishin' tales



3. Ghost stories, witch tales and premonitions



- Premonitions of an impending death or disaster? Who?
- Buildings, caves, woods, which supposedly are haunted?
- Community legends or myths based on murders or other disasters which have occurred in the area?
(young children in elementary school, about 4th -6th grades, often have an extensive repertoire of this type of story or myth.)



4. Legends or myths



- Ask around to find how local physical features (mountains, caves, bluffs, hill, old cemeteries, etc.) developed and/or were named.



5. Traditional tales



- Jack tales, yarns, etc. which have been passed orally from one generation to another.
